i. Case Number: ZA-2021-9304-CUB-CUX

Project Location: 425 W. 8th Street

Item Description/Request: Vibe Nightclub (basement of Bristol Hotel Apartments): Pursuant to LAMC 12.24 W.1, the applicant is requesting a new conditional use to permit the continued on-site sales and consumption of a full-line of alcohol in conjunction with the existing bar/nightclub; with a dance floor and providing 206 interior seats. Hours of operation are from 9 am – 2 am daily in the C5-4D zone.

Pursuant to LAMC 12.24-1,18, the applicant is requesting a conditional use permit to allow for live entertainment and dancing in the C5-4D zone.

**Project Location:** 800 West Sixth Street, Unit 100 Los Angeles, CA 90017 **Item Description/Request:** A Plan Approval for the continued on-site sale and dispensing of a full-line of alcoholic beverages in conjunction with an existing 2,767 square foot restaurant with 126 indoor seats and a 1,611 square foot outdoor patio with 36 seats with hours of operation from 6:00 a.m. to 4:00 a.m., daily. Alcohol service from 6:00 am to 2:00 am.

Motion to support the request for the continued sale and service of beer, wine and distilled spirits for on-site sale and consumption.
