Project Description: A Plan Approval to allow the continued sale of beer and wine for on-site consumption in conjunction with an existing restaurant in the [Q]C4-4D zone.

Project Requests: Pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code (“LAMC”) Section 12.24-W-1, the applicant requests a Plan Approval to allow the continued sale of beer and wine for on-site consumption in the 1,115 sq ft, 25 indoor seats existing restaurant, with hours of 11 am to 2 am, daily. Project Requests: A conditional use for continued dispensing of a full line of alcoholic beverages in a 2015 sq ft space with 83 indoor seats and 10 outdoor seats. Proposed hours are 7 days a week 6AM – 2AM. There will be live entertainment limited to Piano, jazz or string trio.
