**Project Requests:** A Plan Approval to permit the continued sale and dispensing of a full line of alcoholic beverages for on-site consumption and live entertainment in conjunction with an existing 1,304 square foot bar with 50 interior patron seats with hours of operation from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. daily and 12 exterior patron seats on a patio located in a public way with hours of operation from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 a.m. daily.
