LA - Are going to be traffic safety barriers?

RR - The materials should be able to withstand vehicular impacts, and because the median has raised curbs, there's no need to comply with traditional rules around barriers.

This letter tries to bridge the gap between the current MIP project list and what has been requested in other NC letters, e.g. EIFD, Broadway, scramble crosswalks.

DZ - we should reorder projects by priority.

Committee gave permission to submit with changes made during discussion. Public Comment - Tom Grode - DTLA 2040 involvement - wanted to make a recommendation on transporation/land use issue regarding speed bumps in Skid Row. RR - there is a division between 2040 and MIP - the former is a land use plan for development while the latter is for ad hoc projects.

DZ - For speed bumps, we need to specify which intersections in order to submit recommendations to LADOT.
