

The 7th Street Streetscape Improvement Project

*Building a Safer Street For All,
From Figueroa Street to San Pedro Street*



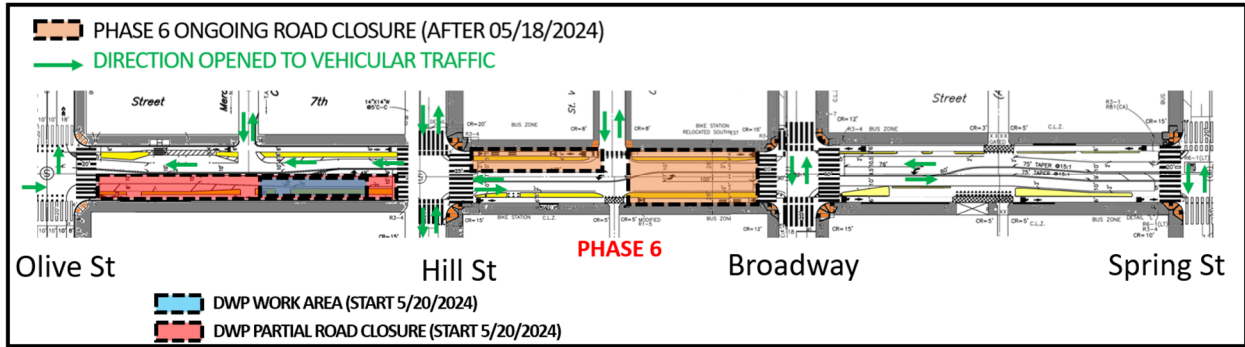
Phase 6 construction continues on the 7th Street Streetscape Improvement Project to make Downtown LA safer for pedestrians and cyclists. During the next road closure, 7th Street from Broadway to Hill Street will be closed to through vehicular traffic from May 18, 2024 to July 6, 2024. St. Vincent Court will remain open from Hill Street going eastbound along 7th Street for local access only. Broadway and Hill Street will remain open at all times during the street closure.*

Due to emergency work needed by LADWP to replace an electrical vault, there will be a partial closure starting May 20, 2024 on 7th Street from Hill Street and Olive Street for approximately 6 weeks. Mercury Court can only be accessed from Hill Street going westbound along 7th Street. Please see the attachment for more information.

Pedestrian and vehicular access are provided to the local businesses and residents. Please prepare for intermittent machinery noise and dust and plan accordingly for additional traffic. There will be flaggers to assist with local access and for traffic circulation.

***Note:** On Saturday, May 18, 2024, there will be a 12-hour road closure from approximately 6:30 AM – 6:30 PM on 7th Street from Spring Street to Olive Street to implement the full road closure on 7th Street from Broadway to Hill Street.

Project Background

Goals of the 7th Street Streetscape Improvement Project are to improve the pedestrian experience, bicycling connectivity and safety, and the transit experience for riders and operators. The project, which will include 7th Street between Figueroa Street and Alameda Street, will make the area a more dynamic and viable urban environment for pedestrians, cyclists, businesses, and residents.
