2. General Public Comment

Public Comment: Frank Zalez - Went to in-person meeting, but got there too late.

Kim Nakushima, Director of Policy and Research for the city tourism department, announced that construction for the convention center's expansion and modernization is moving quickly. A new detail is the planned, temporary closure of Pico Boulevard, which will be quite long and will affect the portion that runs under the convention center. The closure is currently planned for between L.A. Live Way on the west end and Figueroa on the east end. The street closure is planned to begin on December 4th and last until March 31, 2028, pending approval. Pico will likely remain closed to vehicular traffic during the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games. They will include DLANC in communications.

Reeyan mentioned efforts to address nuisance issues, including those at the Santa Fe Arts Colony and the Fashion District with vacant properties and fires and safety concerns. The committee is also still awaiting a response regarding the 110 freeway and the Third Street pedestrian tunnel, which involves coordination between the state and the city.

a. Pico Triangle updates

UPDATE REEYAN: a placemaking initiative spearheaded by DLANC and the South Park Business Improvement District (Social District), which is now seeing new elements on site where Pico and Olive meet. The current status includes ordering more planters, and an opening celebration is tentatively planned for January or February.

b. Spring Street Park

UPDATE Jens/Heera/Reeyan : The committee discussed efforts to get Spring Street Park gates closed at night, a topic for which the community and organizations have been vocal. The Mayor's office, City Council District 14 (CD14), and Recreation and Parks representatives attended a community meeting, which the committee believed was productive. The need to get the park added to the official "park closed list" was identified.

UPDATE Heera: The committee is moving forward with a virtual LAPD public safety community policing forum, with interest from LAPD and the Mayor's office. The tentative date is the week of January 17th. The Arts District Neighborhood Council has agreed to co-host. The search for a moderator is a priority, as the person needs to be credible and neutral. Lawrence Carroll was suggested as a potential moderator.

Committee Member Comments: Rian explained that streetscape projects, including those along Broadway, San Pedro, and 7th Street, have stalled. The Broadway project, for example, is complicated by the old streetcar plan and Metro's new bus rapid transit line plan. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to create a nimble, advisory work group to investigate and organize a coalition effort, initially focusing on Broadway, to figure out how to get the projects up and running again.

Public Comment: Frank Zalez - Doesn't think the city will approve because the city doesn't have money.

Committee Member Comments: The discussion on submitting a Community Impact Statement (CIS) regarding the Capital Improvement Plan and public right-of-way projects was postponed. Rian explained that the mayor issued Executive Directive 9 plan to coordinate city departments regarding a Capital Infrastructure Plan (CIP) because the city's infrastructure is fragmented and failing. The council file seeks to bring this policy into public view and codify some elements into law. The item was postponed to allow for collaboration with the Urban Issues committee.

STATE OF CALIFORNIA PENAL CODE SECTION 403 *(Amended by Stats, 1994, Ch. 923, Sec. 159. Effective January 1, 1995.)*

—

Every person who, without authority of law willfully disturbs or breaks up any assembly or meeting that is not unlawful in its character, other than an assembly or meeting referred to in Section 302 of the Penal Code or Section 18340 of the Elections Code, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

SB411 UPDATES: *If a Neighborhood Council has a quorum of board members in a physical location, board members who wish to join the meeting via teleconferencing must adhere to AB 2449 rules and regulations. If a Neighborhood Council does not have a quorum of board members in a physical location, they must adhere to SB 411 rules and regulations. In the event of a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting to members of the public using the call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the eligible legislative body's control that prevents members of*

the public from offering public comments using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the eligible legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on the meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based service option is restored. Actions taken on agenda items during a disruption that prevents the eligible legislative body from broadcasting the meeting may be challenged pursuant to Section 54960.1. The eligible legislative body shall not require public comments to be submitted in advance of the meeting and shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the legislative body and offer comments in real time. Notwithstanding Section 54953.3, an individual desiring to provide public comment through the use of an internet website, or other online platform, not under the control of the eligible legislative body, that requires registration to log in to a teleconference may be required to register as required by the third-party internet website or online platform to participate. (i) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed public comment period for each agenda item shall not close the public comment period for the agenda item, or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph , to provide public comment until that timed public comment period has elapsed. (ii) An eligible legislative body that does not provide a timed public comment period, but takes public comment separately on each agenda item, shall allow a reasonable amount of time per agenda item to allow public members the opportunity to provide public comment, including time for members of the public to register pursuant to subparagraph (D), or otherwise be recognized for the purpose of providing public comment. (iii) An eligible legislative body that provides a timed general public comment period that does not correspond to a specific agenda item shall not close the public comment period or the opportunity to register, pursuant to subparagraph (D), until the timed general public comment period has elapsed.
